Halland Voice Statement

What residents tell us is that Speed and Road safety is a big issue. They value the speed camera and flashing sign – these stops our homes shaking and keeps the noise down. It makes it easier for us to get in and out of our properties and safer for our children. We'd like to extend the 30mph to the far edges of the village. This isn't just about reduced speed limit signs, but enforcement too – we know that when the speed camera on the A22 was out of commission for a year the speed limits were ignored and as a result the air ambulance landed twice.

We have nowhere to meet that belongs to the community. There are two hotels and a pub in the village, however the meeting facilities at the Forge and the Blacksmiths arms are too small and Crockstead is at the extremes of the village – there are no pavements between the hotel and the village so it makes it impractical as a meeting space. That doesn't mean we don't value these facilities, but it makes it difficult to hold a meeting about local issues for example. Most planning and council meetings take place in East Hoathly – this is where the facilities are, but if a Halland resident who does not drive wishes to attend then they can get there by bus, but not home again unless they walk – either though the fields in the dark or along the very busy A22 in the dark where there is no pavement.

There is nowhere safe for children to play. There is no park, no space that is safe to use. We don't want to replicate the facilities in East Hoathly – what would be better would be new and different facilities to be installed that compliment these. For example a woodland adventure park or even a lido! Or to think a little outside of the box the East Hoathly Football pitch suffers from water logging that has been impossible to cure due to its low lying nature and the parish children have long wanted a skate park – why not find a site in Halland to create one or both of these facilities?

Older residents in particular who remember the bonfire society parades coming to Halland would like to feel part of the event again – the A22 divides our community and for one night we'd like to be linked again. Closing the A22 between the villages would make the event safer and could provide additional car parking.
